Fahrenheit 451
by Ray Bradbury

Ray Bradbury will work with St. Bonaventure students to explore the play Fahrenheit 451 based on his dystopian speculative fiction novel authored by Ray Bradbury and first published in 1953.

The novel presents a future American society in which the masses are hedonistic, and critical thought through reading is outlawed. Over the years, the novel has been subject to various interpretations, primarily focusing on the historical role of book burning in suppressing dissenting ideas. Bradbury has stated that the novel is not about censorship; he states that *Fahrenheit 451* is a story about how television destroys interest in reading literature, which leads to a perception of knowledge as being composed of "factoids", partial information devoid of context, e.g., Napoleon's birth date alone, without an indication of who he was.

Guidance Office News

The College Search

There are thousands of four-year colleges and universities in the United States so before you start filling out applications, you need to narrow down your search. There are a number of sources that will help you do this.

Your Guidance Counselor: (Seniors, see Mr. Hahn; Juniors and Sophomores, see Mrs. LaJoie; and Freshmen, see Mrs. Valle) The counselor has access to an abundance of information (college bulletins, catalogs, and applications). The more your college counselor sees you and learns about you, the easier it is for them to help you. Make sure you stop by their office often, whether it's to talk about your progress or just to say, "hi".

Your Teachers: Use your teachers as resources too; many of them have had years of experience in their field. They have taught thousands of students and watched them go off to college and careers. Teachers often stay in contact with graduates and know about their experiences in college and may be familiar with the schools you are interested in attending. Ask your teachers how they feel about the match between you and your choice of schools and if they think you will be able to succeed in that environment.

Your Family: Your family needs to be an integral part of the college selection process, whether they are financing your education or not. They have opinions and valuable advice. Listen to them carefully. Try to absorb all their information, and see if it applies to you. Does it fit with who you are and what you want? What works and what doesn't for you? Is some of what they say dated? How long ago was their experience and how relevant is it today? Take the information, thank them for their concern, and compare what they have said with the information you are gathering.

Colleges and Universities: Don't forget to go to college fairs. The admissions counselors of hundreds of colleges, vocational/career colleges, and universities attend college fairs every year. Bring a shopping bag for all the information you will get.

The annual Ventura County College Fair will be held at Ventura High School this year in late October or early November. Contact the Ventura High School College Counselor Career Center Office at (805) 641-5116 for more information.

Admissions officers also will be visiting St. Bonaventure H.S. on a regular basis. See Mr. Hahn in the Counseling Office and/or the SBHS Gazette for a schedule of college visits to SBHS in the fall.

It's helpful to attend these sessions since consistent contact between student and a college is tracked by colleges and universities. An admissions decision may come down to examining the size of your admissions folder and the number of interactions you have had with the school over time.

A college's Web site can give you a glimpse of campus life that does not appear in the college's brochure and catalog. Read the student newspaper. Visit college-sponsored chat rooms. Go to the department in the major you are investigating. Look at the Course Bulletin to see what courses are required.

Online Help: To help you find two-year and four-year colleges or universities, check out the following online resources for additional information on college selection, scholarships, student information, and much more.

Peterson's College Search. Peterson's.com provides information and tools that will help you prepare, search, and pay for college. It also offers tips on financial aid, test preparation, and online applications.

Campus Visits: You've heard the old saying, "A picture is worth a thousand words". A campus visit is worth a thousand brochures. Nothing beats walking around a college campus to get the feel for it. Some students report that all they needed to know that they loved or hated a campus was to drive through it. Write or call in advance to take student-conducted campus tours. If possible, stay overnight in a dorm to see what living at a college is really like. Bring a copy of your transcript so that you are prepared to interview with admission officers. Take this opportunity to ask questions about financial aid and other services that are available to students. The final goal of the campus visit is to study the school's personality and decide if it matches yours. Your parents should be involved with the campus visits so that you can share your impressions.

The school year has come to an end and the Seraph spring teams have finished with a flourish. The Girls Varsity softball team ended their season strong with an overall record of 16-9, finishing third in a very strong Tri Valley League. They picked up two wins in the postseason over Gahr and Pac 7 champion Righetti before falling to the third over all seed in Crescenta Valley.
